Qualifications

- Knowledge of entomology or willing to learn about invertebrates
- Comfortable working with and handling a variety of invertebrates
- Enthusiastic and outgoing
- Desire to learn and willingness to accept direction
- Reliable and punctual
- Able to work independently, with small groups and the public (children and adults)
- Strong communication skills

Responsibilities

- Assist with feeding/watering and caring for a variety of live invertebrates including spiders, scorpions, centipedes and assassin bugs
- Handling of feeder crickets, flies and cockroaches
- Cleaning and cage maintenance
- Show bugs to the public; share information about invertebrate diversity, life history and adaptations
- Monitor food supplies and ensure restocking is complete
- Follow guidelines and staff direction on care and maintenance
- Successfully complete required training

Rewards

- Experience in Entomology and caring for invertebrates
- Opportunity to learn about the diversity of invertebrates and contribute in a large research, educational and curatorial museum

Volunteer experience will also help build basic workplace skills development:

- Personal Management Skills (flexibility, adaptability, time management)
- Teamwork Skills (working with others and contributing to projects & tasks)
- Communication Skills (share information, clarify ideas, public speaking)

Time Commitment

- One 3 to 4 hour shift per week, with a minimum commitment of 6 months
